

## ROMANS 6:1-10

Below is a section of scripture to read and discuss with your students, as well as some application questions. I encourage each of you to take your time going through these, and adding questions as you see fit! Please be open and honest while answering the questions **alongside** your students. There is also an activity you can do with your students as well, in order to help them focus on the topic!

**ACTIVITY:** Last week you were to write down ways in which God is trustworthy. Take a few minutes and share those with each other now. How does this impact how you see God?

After this, with your student(s), take a few minutes to write down a time where you did something mean to someone else and it hurt their feelings. How did it make them feel? How did it make you feel? Discuss your examples together for a few minutes.

### APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

1. The Bible talks a lot about resurrection. What do you think resurrection means? Is it just physical?
2. In this section, Paul talks about a spiritual resurrection and a new life free from sin. What do you think Paul means by this? Does this mean that we no longer sin?
3. We know that Easter Sunday is a commemoration of Jesus dying on the cross and coming back to life, defeating sin and death once and for all. What does it mean to you that Jesus paid for your sin? How does He call you to live because of His sacrifice? How has his resurrection changed your life?
4. In verses 5-10 Paul talks about believers in Christ being crucified with Him and resurrected with Him. He talks about us turning away from our old life and walking in a new life with Christ. How are you walking in your new life? How are you rejecting sin and living for God? How is God changing you?

**CLOSING ACTIVITY:** Take a few minutes and help your student(s) write out a plan for how they want to live their life walking with Jesus. What are their goals? What kind of values do they have? What do they believe to be right/just? Take some time and answer any questions your student may have. You should also use this time to share with your student how Jesus has changed your life, and is continuing to change you each and every day.

**HOMEWORK:** Pray this week about what God wants to renew in your life. Write down some goals you have that you want to accomplish this week in order to overcome sin in your life. Parents and students, be ready to share these with each other next week.
