Back to Life: The Importance of Community

Hello, parents and students!

Below is a section of scripture to read and discuss with your students, as well as some application questions. I encourage each of you to take your time going through these, and adding questions as you see fit! Please be open and honest while answering the questions *alongside* your students. There is also an activity you can do with your students as well, in order to help them focus on the topic!

ACTIVITY: Discuss a time this week that your student(s) and you have had a disagreement. Please do this as a family. How did the conflict make you feel? How did you resolve it? Please take turns sharing how it made you feel.

SCRIPTURE: [Hebrews 10:24-25](#)

QUESTIONS: For today's lesson, we will be focussing on something a little different. The scripture above in Hebrews defines the importance of community and meeting together. Since quarantine started, being in community with one another has been difficult. Please take this time to discuss the following questions with your student(s). Both of you should share your answers. Be open, honest, and candid with one another. Please let your students know that they have free reign to express how they feel.

1. How has this time of separation and isolation made you feel? What have been some things you have missed? Who have you missed?
2. What has been the hardest part about not meeting with your friends/community on Sundays? Why do you think you miss these things?
3. Why do you think that a weekly gathering is important? Do you think that gathering at church helps you grow in your faith? How/why?
4. What is one thing you wish your parents/student(s) knew about your struggles right now? How can they help you? How can you help them understand?
5. What is one thing in your life right now that you wish would go back to normal? Are you frustrated about this? How does this affect the way you interact with your family?

CLOSING ACTIVITY: Take a few minutes with your student(s) to write down one way you can be in prayer for one another this week, as well as one way you can serve each other.

HOMEWORK: Pray for your parents/student(s), as well as practice serving each other in one way this week.
